Her work highlights the importance of responsible water usage and aims to support communities facing water scarcity.

Since arriving in India on 21st February this year with BOPA, the Miss England delegation has been actively engaged in a series of humanitarian visits. These include time spent with the Eknor Charity Trust, Unique Home for Girls, an eye hospital supporting those in need of vital treatment, and the Lions Public School in Chandigarh and the Cordia Institute with plans to visit the Alma School of London .
